Increase Lower Hall Rental Revenue - Help Empty the Stage!


Can you help move Church Enhancement items and shelves from the stage roadside and lakeside to the Westview Room? No heavy lifting just a whole lot of stuff.

This year's conference theme is "Land, Language, and Liberation." Our gathering will be held in Montréal, which is not only the largest city in Québec but is also a crossroads for the cultures of First Nations, the descendants of English and French settlers, and immigrants from around the world. Together we will reflect on issues that continue to challenge the peoples of Québec, of Canada, and all of North America.

Edith Rankin is collaborating with the Tuskegee University Golden Voices Concert Choir Tour through Tom Mawhinney. Edith Rankin will be hosting the choir for lunch before their Kingston Concert on March 11th. Get your tickets today for this amazing night of music. You wont be disappointed.

With spirited direction, exemplary discipline, strong, young voices, and a stirring repertoire, this is a choir that choral music lovers should not miss.

The Golden Voices Concert Choir, founded in 1886, was directed from 1931 to 1955 by William Levi Dawson, the first person to arrange the songs of the slavery era for four-part choirs. His arrangements are still cherished and many of his works are still widely performed and form a core component of today's choir's broad repertoire.

Dr. Wayne Barr has been director of the Golden Voices since 2001. The choir has the rare distinction of having performed for four different US Presidents by invitation. Under Dr. Barr, rehearsals run for two hours a day, six days a week.

All proceeds go to Tuskegee University.


The plan for the evening:
